Intent	<p>At Windhill Primary children in KS2 learn Spanish as part of our curriculum. We aim to prepare children for the KS3 language curriculum to enable them to transfer confidently and successfully. We follow a home-created curriculum that helps children learn to understand and respond to spoken and written language. Children also learn to speak with increasing confidence, fluency and spontaneity, finding ways of communicating what they want to say, including through discussion and asking questions, and that they are continually improving the accuracy of their pronunciation and intonation. The four key language learning skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing will be taught and all necessary grammar will be covered in an age-appropriate way across the primary phase. A primary focus of this curriculum is also to equip pupils with the skills they need to understand and be understood when in a Spanish speaking country, such as during a holiday.</p>

They will learn how to structure sentences in Spanish and how to include grammar into their writing.</p>	<p>Speaking Children will develop skills to enable them to have conversations around the core vocabulary learnt from the programme. Children understand and are able to pronounce letters from the Spanish alphabet including the vowel sounds.</p>
